***Families offered fun way to discover contemporary art
at Family Day April 3***

Atlanta—March 31, 2010 – The Atlanta Contemporary Art Center (ACAC) has developed a fun and interactive way for children and parents to experience contemporary art.

ACAC Artistic Director Stuart Horodner, with design assistance from ACAC photography and graphic design intern LaKara Reid, a recent graduate of Columbus State University, has created a coloring and activity book based on the art work in the current ACAC exhibition “Substitute Teacher.”

The art work can be explored through the book’s interactive word searches, images to color, fill-in the blanks, connect the dots, mazes and other activities. The book also uses contemporary art to prompt questions about geography, symbols, language and professions.

The book will be launched at ACAC’s Family Day April 3 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

“It is ideally suited for children between the ages of 4-10,” said Horodner.

“Substitute Teacher” is an exhibition co-curated by Regine Basha and Horodner, which includes 20 emerging and established artists whose works act as an alternative syllabus for art-life learning.

“For our exhibition, a substitute teacher is any being, situation, or object that has the potential to impart knowledge,” said Horodner. “*Substitute Teacher*” is an exhibition which examines reversals of authority and alternative forms of understanding, experience and curiosity.”

ACAC admission is free for children under age 12, \$3 for students and seniors, \$5 for general admission and free for members.

The Atlanta Contemporary Art Center is a non-profit, multi-disciplinary arts organization dedicated to excellence, experimentation, and education in all forms of contemporary art and culture.
